



Welcome to Gunuma Lodge

This is going to be FUN! We have Gunuma Lodge, a 20 bedroom lodge to ourselves from 4pm Friday 18 November, until 4pm on Sunday 20 November. The lodge was built by Tina and Columbine's Mum and Dad and 200 hundred of their closest mates during the 1970s. It is a lot like a youth hostel, in that there is a lot of sharing and simple facilities, and because it is a whole lot of fun.

What to take:

- sheets
- towels
- soap and personal toiletries
- food and drink
- clothes

What you find there:

- Everything you'll need to cook with a large communal kitchen. It is really well kitted out. We have a coffee machine, but the coffee plungers are more reliable.
- Each room has a basin, two/one beds (if you get two just push them together) and spare kids mattresses. The rooms also have pillows and wool blankets (BYO sheets - and doonas if your prefer that). Sometimes kids nick all the pillow to make pillow forts in a room, so if you are missing something check the other rooms.
- You'll find a male and female bathroom in each wing.
- You will also find a sauna, ski and boot room, wet weather gear room, laundry, playroom, and a TV and pool room downstairs.
- Upstairs you'll find the fireplace, lounge, dining and kitchen. You are welcome to BYO ipods to plugin to the stereo, or CDs if you are old school.

Arriving

When you arrive at Gunuma Lodge, there are a couple of things to do to help the lodge run smoothly.

1. Unload your car

Where possible, unload via the front door (from the main car park near the Smiggins slopes). If unloading on Plum Pine Road remember there are hefty fines for parking on the road.

2. Door code

The Code for the front door during your stay at the lodge is: CX.

3. Sign in

Look at the room allocation sheet and write your name on the whiteboard. Please also sign the Accommodation Register – it's a large red book. If you are going out on a big walk/run use the whiteboard to advise your route.

While we are there

As a group we will need to coordinate rubbish removal at the end of the weekend, fill the wood-box and do a chore (as listed on the back of your bedroom door) before we leave.

Checking out

Checkout is 4pm Sunday.

Please ensure your chore has been completed and the following tasks completed:

- Remove your bedding and cover beds neatly with the bedspread
- Fold blankets and stack on top of the shelving
- Vacuum floor – vacuums are stored in the lounge room (upstairs) and in the closet of the kids playroom (downstairs)
- Empty rubbish bin and replace plastic bag liner
- Wipe sink and surrounding area (bathroom cupboard contains cloths cleaning agent)
- Set thermostat to 10° C (this ensures the water pipes do not freeze and burst)
- Shut the window, if open
- Close the blind
- Remove your name from the whiteboard

Rubbish

We will need to sort our waste and then take it to the [Perisher Waste Station](#) – behind the ambulance station in Perisher. (Garbage, recyclables & compost are only collected during the Perisher Snow Season).

- Bottles, Cans & Plastic goes in NPWS issued clear plastic bags.
- Paper & cardboard goes in NPWS issued white woven or clear plastic bags.
- Put non-recyclable waste in the heavy duty black or green bags.
